History in the Making

Black Innovation Fellowship

Black Innovation Fellowship (BIF) empowering the next wave of black entrepreneurs was launched in early May, 2019, at Ryerson University in collaboration with Philanthropist Isaac Olowolafe Jr. who founded the only venture capital fund in Canada led by a team of Black investors. BIF is the first of its kind partnership in Canada between Ryerson University's Digital Media Zone (DMZ) designed to (a) address the challenges faced by young Black entrepreneurs and (b) help diverse communities succeed because they continue to face barriers e.g. lack of access to capital, a lack of diversity in investors and also a lack of minority role models.

Ryerson University's DMZ was launched in April 2010. It is the first of its kind in Canada and it's the University's business incubator for early-stage technology start-ups worldwide. At that time, Sheldon Levy, who was President announced his intention to make digital media top priority for the University. Since then, the Programme has been helping black entrepreneurs.

It is hoped that the partnership will encourage more such



collaborations due to the support of Ryerson's DMZ's award winning incubator network that encourages access to exclusive mentorship, opportunities, custom programming and ready access to funding.

Paulette Senior, President & CEO of the Canadian Women's Foundation and a 2016 Honouree of 100 ABC Women is also part of the Founding Partnership of BIF.

Norma's Ripe Banana Fritters

Ingredients

1

- ripe banana
- 1 tbsp. sugar 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 tsp. valina 1/2 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp. baking powder1 tbsp. flour salt to taste oil for frying

Directions

- 1. Crush ripe banana and add sugar
- 2. Add egg, vanilla and nutmeg; mix until smooth
- 3. Combine baking powder, salt and flour and add to banana mixture
- 4. Drop by tablespoon and fry in oil as per pancakes
- 5. Drain on paper towels
- 6. Sprinkle sugar slightly and serve with marmalade
