Biennially, the co-authors of the publication '100 Accomplished Black Canadian Wom-

Caribbean: Anguilla, Antigua, Aruba, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Montserrat, St. Kitts-Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and Trinidad and Tobago.

Africa: Cameroon, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Sudan, Rwanda. Uganda and Zimbabwe

Europe: United Kingdom, Greece, Romania

Their backgrounds broaden the richness of our nation. Our Honourees continually provide us with opportunities to celebrate them. Many are multi-lingual, fought to uplift not only themselves, but, their children and grandchildren, neighbourhoods and communities. They are committed to advocacy for better and higher education, anti-Black racism, fairness in the workplace and pay equity. They have done so proudly, passiontely and fearlessly.

Our Accomplished Black Canadian women have started businesses and been on the frontline during this global pandemic. They mentor the younger generation and instill the importance of being contributors to Canada's vibrancy.
