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Posthumously Speaking—HerStory



She was born on October 18, 1929 in Calgary, Alberta. She was the descendant of Black settlers from the United States. Her life consisted of several important milestones. She was the first Black person to obtain a law degree in Alberta, the first Black person admitted to the Alberta Bar and the first Black female lawyer in Canada. She was also the first Black female lawyer in canada. She was also the first woman appointed to an executive position with the YMCA in the United States.

Her paternal grandparents moved to Keystone (now Breton), Alberta, from Oklahoma in 1911. They were attracted to Canada, after discovering the Federal Government's cam-paign, enticing American farmers to immigrate to the country. However, the Canadian government did not expect Black firmewroter, the Canadan government dui tocheer quickly moved to Calgary in 1919. John worked as a sleeping car porter with the Canadian Pacific Railway

and Stella worked as a seamstress. They had four children together, two boys and two girls.

Violet shattered glass ceilings and broke down colour barriers to pave the way for future generations. Violet snattered gass cenings and broke down colour partners to pave the way for future generations. Her hard work and drive to excel in all facets of her career are an inspiration for those who also aspire to do great things in their field. In 1998, Violet King was inducted to the National YMCA Hall of Fame. And now you know the rest of HerStory.

Violet passed away from cancer in New York City on March 30, 1982 at age 52.

GINGER PUMPKIN BREAD



Ingredients

- 12 tbsp Unsalted butter, melted (1 ½ sticks) plus room temperature butter for pan
- 2 $^{\prime\!\!/}_{2}$ cups All-purpose flour leveled cups All-purpose flour leveled
- 2 tsp Baking Powder
- 2 tsp Ground ginger powder
- 1 tsp Salt
- ³/₄ cup Granulated sugar
- ³/₄ cup Packed light Brown sugar (you can add a ¹/₄ cup more if you want it sweeter)
- 3 Large eggs
- 3/4 cup Pumpkin puree (blend pumpkin in blender)

Directions

In a large bowl, mix together flour, ginger power, baking powder and salt. In a medium bowl, whisk together sugars, pumpkin, melted butter and eggs; add flour mixture and stir until just combined. Place in a buttered/floured loaf pan.

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Bake for 40 mins and then 20 mins at 300F, bake until a toothpick inserted in centre of loaf comes out clean. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.
