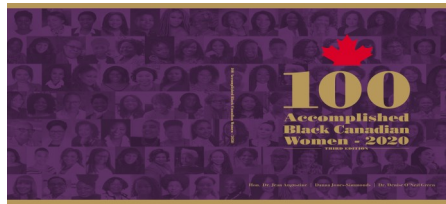

About Emancipation in Canada—August 1st

On March 24, 2021, the House of Commons voted unanimously to officially designate August 1 Emancipation Day. It marks the actual day in 1834 that the *Slavery Abolition Act* of 1833 came into effect across the British Empire.

Canadians are not always aware that Black and Indigenous Peoples were once enslaved on the land that is now Canada. Those who fought enslavement were pivotal in shaping our society to be as diverse as it is today.

Therefore, each August 1, Canadians are invited to reflect, educate and engage in the ongoing fight against anti-Black racism and discrimination.

Emancipation Day celebrates the strength and perseverance of Black communities in Canada.

Posthumously Speaking The Rest of HerStory



Born in London, Ontario in 1918, she was an actress, mother, volunteer worker and activist for minority rights. She was the daughter of James and Christine Jenkins. Her father was an Assistant Judge of the Juvenile Court in London and a leading

figure in the local Black Community. Her mother instilled in her, a concept of community awareness. One of the province's earliest Black newspapers, which her parents founded, also had a great influence on her interest in Black history and the contributions of Black people in North America.

In 1950, she joined a woman's social club known as the Dilettantes. She quickly changed the name to the Canadian Negro Women's Association (CANEWA). This organization was the forerunner of the First National Congress of Black Women. As the organization's first President from 1951 to 1953, she encouraged other members to take up service projects. An early undertaking was one that would continue throughout the club's existence was the provision of scholarships to deserving Black students. Later activities included the organization of the Calypso Carnival (the forerunner of the Caribbean Festival). She died in 1975.

In 2012, Kay Livingstone was recognized by the Canadian Government as a Person of National Historic Significance. And now you know the rest of HerStory!

Stuffed Breadfruit



Ingredients

- Large Breadfruit (full, but not ripe)
- 1/4 lb minced beef
- 1/4 lb minced ham
- Small amount of pickled meat (optional)
- 1 small onion—chopped
- Salt and Pepper to taste
- 2 Tablespoons butter
- 1 Medium tomato chopped

Instructions

Peel and parboil breadfruit whole in salted water

Lightly fry chopped onion, escallion and tomato in butter and add to minced meat and cook until meat is almost done.

Cook breadfruit and from stalk end, but cut out the core and scoop out some of the 'meat'.

Fill the cavity with meat mixture

Bake in a moderate oven until soft and of a nice golden brown colour for about 50 minutes

Serves 8.
