

She spent thirteen years as Executive Director, which was her last position before retiring in 2008. The Alzheimer's Society of Chatham-Kent was started by a group in 1983 who were affected by Alzheimer's disease. It was identified that there was a lack of resources

and support services. In November 1986, the Society received its charitable registration number and achieved full chapter status.

After her retirement, she worked as a part-time trainer for Chatham-Kent Children's Services (CKCS). This organization is an accredited multi-service agency that responds to the unique dynamic needs of families. It supports the well-being and safety of children and their families, through evidence-based practices and collaboration with community partners. Together, the CKCS employees strive to foster an environment that encourages positive growth, professional development and progressive change. Cheryl was passionate about her community. This was evident through her involvement with various organizations such as Chatham Rotary Club, Community Living Chatham -Kent, Tilbury Health Team, Chatham-Kent Consumer Family Network, Buxton National Historic Site & Museum, North Buxton Community Club, Family Services Kent, African-Canadian Association of Chatham-Kent, the Camera Club and the Schizophrenia Society of Ontario. She was always wearing a sunny smile, had an infectious laugh and was an angel who touched the heart and lives of many. She passed away peacefully at home on April 3, 2018. Coconut Pie

Ingredients

- 6 oz short crust pastry
 - 1 1/2 cups flour
 - 1-2 eggs
 - 1/4 to 1/2 cup sugar
 - **Pinch of Salt**
 - 1 cup milk
 - 1/2 cup freshly grated coconut



Instructions

Make pastry, roll out and line in a pie dish or deep plate.

Prick the bottom and set on ice till re-

Grate coconut. Boil milk. Lightly beat eggs (it need not be frothy), add sugar and salt and stir in hot milk and coconut.

Pour filling into pastry case, bake at once in fairly hot oven (400 degree F). Reduce heat after first 10 min., otherwise custard mixture will boil and curdle. Cook until pastry is golden brown and mixture set-about 30-40 min. Serves 3-4.
