Dear Canada: This *Black History Month*, 100 ABC Women is pleased to honour and celebrate the achievements of Black Canadians who have made significant contributions to the Canadian communities. We are particularly proud of the achievements of 300 Accomplished Black Canadian (ABC) Women whose achievements reside in our database, whom we proudly call our Honourees. We are also proud of Honouree and Co-author, Honourable Dr. Jean Augustine, who, legislatively, made Black History Month possible in Canada.

Biennially, the co-authors of the publication '100 Accomplished Black Canadian Women', solicit national nominations to locate and celebrate Black, Canadian excellence. Their expertise fall within the areas of: Consulting, Creative Arts, Education, Engineering, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Government, Healthcare, Legal, Media, Not-for-Profit and Trade Union. While the majority of our Honourees are Canadian-born, many migrated to Canada from countries such as:

Caribbean: Anguilla, Antigua, Aruba, Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Montserrat, St. Kitts-Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and Trinidad and Tobago.

Africa: Cameroon, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Sudan, Rwanda, Uganda and Zimbabwe

Europe: United Kingdom, Greece, Romania

Their backgrounds broaden the richness of our nation. Our Honourees continually provide us with opportunities to celebrate them. Many are multi-lingual, fought to uplift not only themselves, but, their children and grandchildren, neighbourhoods and communities. They are committed to advocacy for better and higher education, anti-Black racism, fairness in the workplace and pay equity. They have done so proudly, passionately and fearlessly.

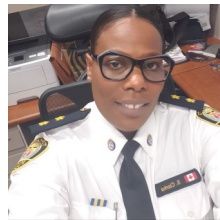

Should There Be A Virtual Symposium & Book Launch Gala?



Is it still feasible for 100 ABCWOMEN to hold the SYMPOSIUM and the 2020 BOOK LAUNCH AND GALA as planned on September 2021?

The first Symposium was held in September 2020 and as a biennial event, the next one was planned for September 2021. The book launch & gala was originally scheduled for September 2020, but due to the pandemic, was rescheduled for September 2021. This information serves as the baseline for what comes next.

The daily reports in Toronto regarding the status of COVID-19 in Ontario, reflect a "yo-yo" effect - one day the numbers rise up and the next they are down. The researchers at Women's College Hospital have noticed that although Black Canadians make up only 10% of the entire Canadian population (and we recognize Ontario is a big chunk of that), they have a 20% percentage rate for COVID-19. It has been stated that many other countries with predominantly Black populations, the death rate from COVID has been lower than in "developed" countries.

100 ABC Women has been monitoring the various information being presented publicly on the rates of COVID-19 and definitely more keenly on the Canadian facts with a razor focus on Ontario. Two of our resources with medical expertise have been assisting us with assessing the situation in order to make informed decisions.

In addition to the measures (masks, gloves, washing hands, social/physical distancing) which have been in place since the diagnosis of COVID-19 became the norm, there has been a shaky roll out of two or three vaccines. Given the announcement of some delay in shipments of promised vaccines, it is difficult for 100 ABC Women to make final arrangements for the September event at this time. We have had reports that the new directions and new strains of the virus in fact added to the mix, which makes planning events very challenging. It is hoped that by our April newsletter, we will have a firm announcement about our scheduled events. Being cautious is our mantra over the next few months.

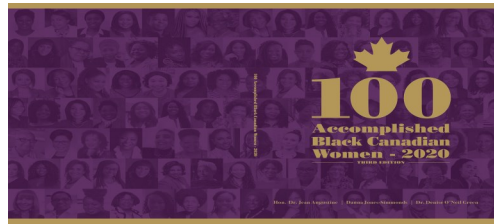
