2023 SYMPOSIUM: BLACK WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY

The 2023 Symposium met its key goals. Our event raised awareness of the significant and often overlooked contributions of Black women in the technology field in Canada and the ongoing barriers they face in fully participating in this vital economic sector. The symposium is a first of its kind, bringing together Black women known for their contributions to tech to raise awareness and promote empowerment, inclusivity, and engagement in the sector. Throughout the day, discussions were hosted by a range of speakers working in diverse tech fields, including but not limited to Natural Language Processing, Cloud Computing, Tech Policy & Lobbying, Black Speculative Design, and Academia.

Participants reported beneficial knowledge sharing about opportunities to get involved and build new mentorships and relationships, as well as new perspectives and attitudes about the important contributions of Black women in the field. They enhanced awareness about ongoing efforts and strategies to combat persistent discriminatory and racist barriers. Like at all of our events, we saw numerous examples of intergenerational relationship-building, with young people building connections and engaging in exciting ways.

Following the event, 100ABCWomen received interest from both major Vancouver universities (SFU and UBC) in our work, with strengthened connections and discussions of future ongoing partnerships.





Two comments from participants highlight some of the day's successes:

"One thing I've realized is that so many people in the tech sector have a lot of mentors, and sometimes because you don't have mentors who look like you, the context is always different."

"We have different experiences, backgrounds, and stories, and when nobody else has a similar perspective, it can be quite challenging in the tech sector. So we need more well-connected people who understand the theory and who know the challenges that Black people see."



MAJOR CHALLENGES

We struggled to secure sufficient funding before the event, so we scaled back the size of the Symposium and cancelled the Reception component of the day. Nonetheless, the event succeeded in achieving its key goals.

A major unanticipated hurdle was the presence of a workers' strike outside the building on the day of the event; we know that our in-person attendance was impacted by confusion among people who intended to attend the symposium.
